

<u>Testimony</u>

I harbored deep wounds and false beliefs which influenced my choices and view of the world. A lifestyle I came to embrace and eventually choose. Unforgiveness and selfishness consumed me. I hurt my family and society in numerous ways. Abusing drugs, alcohol and womanizing, I lived what I thought was the life I always wanted as a kid. A drug trafficker and fugitive for 7 years in Mexico before being captured and sent to Alaska. Contemplating suicide. Then Jesus saved my life. TLC taught me about God while learning to deal with my childhood traumas and wounds. To identify my false beliefs, triggers, coping behaviors and thinking errors; then replace them with new healthy beliefs based on God's Word.

What Sunday Service is like in jail

The Bible says we are to hear the Word preached and to preach the Word. Its already incredible that we are able to hear the Word preached while in jail but to learn to preach while here is unimaginable. In this Mod we have a praise team that picks songs for

worship. During our worship we have 2 singers, a piano player, and sound equipment. We have a different member of our Senior Team each Sunday write and present his own sermon. Our Chaplain comes in the last Sunday of every month to play guitar and lead us in worship and a sermon. **Praise**
